## **JOB SUMMARY:**

The World Link Program at the Queen's University International Centre (QUIC) promotes learning, sharing, acceptance, and celebration of diverse cultures within the Queen's community. World Link (WL) Ambassadors participate in planning and facilitation of social and cultural activities (e.g. games nights, movie nights, bus trips) that promote interaction & cultural learning between international, exchange and domestic students in the Queen's community. World Link Ambassadors work closely with the program coordinator, a team of program volunteers and with the QUIC staff.

## **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Assist in the planning and delivery of WL social events;
- Building a respectful inclusive rapport with participants;
- Ensuring event participants have a positive experience and are engaged in activities;
- Ensuring proper completion of housekeeping tasks (incl. kitchen and hall set-up, clean-up);
- Promotion of WL events/activities;
- Assisting in program evaluation;
- Other duties as needed.


# WHAT IS REQUIRED:

- Facilitation skills with the ability to energize and engage others;

- Media, web, presentation and graphic design skills and experience;
